Narayanan Repeats at Class Chess Championships

Sammy Narayanan will have another chance to win the outright State Championship in 2023. Sammy secured this opportunity by once again winning the Master/Expert section (average rating of 2135) at the Class Championships in mid-November. Sammy's draw with fellow FM Alice Lee in Round 4 secured his victory with 3.5/4.0 points. Sammy had "draw odds" (and the white pieces) in the critical Round 4 match-up of these two top-ranked players since Lee had been upset by Tim Radermacher in Round 2. Sammy will now look to improve on a stellar 2022 when he scored 4/5 points in his first ever State Championship Playoffs to become Co-Champion with legendary 11-time State Champion Sean Nagle. Ultimately Sammy lost to Sean in the rapid round of their 2022 State Championship Tiebreaker.

In the Class A/B Section it was rising star Daniel Garrett posting a perfect 4/4 to claim 1st prize and 35 rating points. The everpresent and always-tough Bill Murray took 2nd with 3.5/4.0. Obviously Bill's rating has generally been over 2000 this past year...so he was a tough out in the A/B Section with his tournament rating start of 1969.

The C/D was paced by Jeremy Keillor and his 3.5/4.0 points. Jeremy prevailed in the head-to-head match-ups with the C/D section runner-ups. In Round 3, Jeremy won against Jeffery

Devich, and then in Round 4, he was able to secure the clinching draw against Joshini Sudhakar. Overall Jeremy tallied 43 new rating points to put him at 1591 and very close to moving up to the B class.

The Class E prize was captured by Anvith Pothula with a perfect 4/4 and an astonishing 153 point rating gain to immediately leap into the middle of Class D!!

The U1000 Section went to Ilya Chuhunou who scored 3.5/4.0 points. A key victory happened in Round 1 when Ilya defeated Vanessa Lee. Vanessa would win her next 3 games to finish in a Tie for 2nd with Rishab Jain and Christopher Kurtz.

Neil Kulevsky out-distanced the unrated section by a full point with a perfect 4/4 score. Neil has now accumulated a provisional rating of 1334 and is a newcomer to watch on the Minnesota chess scene.

Overall the tournament featured 78 players and was well-directed by TDs Sarah Emmons & Jackson Wahl. The space was limited to 80 players at the Castle Chess Club and a wait list had to be deployed to make sure there was sufficient space for all of the chess games. The great news is that Minnesota chess is growing and the MSCA looks forward to finding & funding larger tournament sites in the future to support this rapidly growing chess demand.

Radermacher & Hortillosa Share 1st Prize at Senior

22 of the most senior members of our chess community participated in the Senior State Chess Championship on October 22-23 at the Castle Chess Club in Southdale Mall. The senior tournament requires an age of 50+ to participate. This event is always an exciting opportunity for our "experienced" players to enjoy a slower pace of play without being blitzed off the board (like they are most chess weekends) by the younger and more nimble minds of our chess youth.

Meeting the age 50 requirement was no problem as 13 of the 22 participants were age 65+!! It is absolutely wonderful to see this group staying young-at-heart by keeping up with their chess!!

The tournament was also very competitive as 19 of the 22 players finished with point totals in the range of 1.0 - 2.5. This is a rather astonishing result in that no one had less than 1 point, and only 3 of the 22 players managed to score more than 2.5 points in the 4 rounds.

A couple of the "younger" seniors, Andres Hortillosa & Tim Radermacher, finished in a tie for 1st place with 3.5 / 4.0 points. There will be a tiebreaker playoff to determine who represents Minnesota at the Irwin National Tournament of Senior State Champions next summer. Other prize winners included Andres Hortillosa for the U2000 section, Daniel Nenneman for the U1700 section, Scott Carpenter for the U1400 section, and Daniel Voje for the coveted age 65+ category.

President Zagar wins Hall of Fame Classic

We all know Dane Zagar as a Minnesota chess organizer and TD, and also as the President of the MSCA, but don't forget that Dane is also a very good chess player! President Zagar went undefeated to capture clear first prize at this year's edition of the Hall of Fame Classic Tournament. Strong showings were also put in by the Castle's Monday night regular rapid triumvirate of messengers Timm-McNeil-Wasserman who all managed to score 3.5 points to join the pile-up for 2nd place along with Andrew Sheehan and Vihaan Pendse. Pendse, who is from Rochester, now has his rating up to 1987 and may be emerging as the next bright star in the long history of Minnesota scholastic chess success stories.

In the U1900 Section Mohamed Hadj Mohammed and Joshua French tied for 1st prize with 4/5 points. In the U1400 it was Aarav Salil with a tournament start rating of 1063 outpacing the field with 4.5/5.0 points to capture clear first. Overall there was a great turn-out for the event with the 61 players fitting comfortably into the Castle Chess Club space at Southdale Mall.







Linden's younger sister Alice has received many accolades over the last few years as one of Minnesota's premier scholastic chess players on the national scene. However, we must also bring to attention the great chess stretch Linden has put together during his first fall away at college.

Linden is playing on Yale's chess team and they beat Harvard in their annual chess match in November by the score of 2.5 - 1.5. Linden scored a crucial draw in his game to secure the victory for Yale. Linden also

played in the Collegiate Chess League and won his division 2 comprised of 16 players. Over the winter break Linden participated in the North American Open in Las Vegas and scored 5.5/9.0 points in the super challenging Open Section. This lifted his USCF rating to 2301 as he had victories against a GM and an IM, and also a draw against another GM. Next up for Linden will be the Pan American Intercollegiate Team Chess Championships in Seattle. Go Linden!!
